

Background Bolton's Fund: Small Grants

Bolton's Fund: Small Grants are to support Small and Medium community groups and charities. In order to be eligible for a grant in the Micro Grants fund, the organisation must have an income of between £10,000 and up to £1m in the last full financial year.

All projects that receive funding had to demonstrate how their proposed project will address one or more of the Bolton's Fund priorities listed below. The maximum grant size is £5,000.

11 applications were received in Batch 2 totalling £49,480.00

The grant assessment panel awarded funding to six of the projects.
